Dear Friends:

You also missed the first chance to meet our new Consul-General, his wife, and their son, but we think most of you have made up for that in the meantime by accepting their gracious invitation to the cocktail party in honor of Queen Juliana on her birthday, April 30. During our last board meeting we have put together a tentative program for the remainder of this year, which we will mention below. First some details about our next activity.
