A N N U A L M E E T I N G

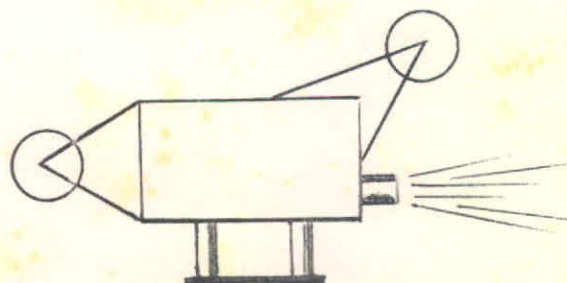
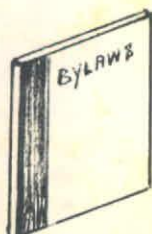

Sixty members have paid their dues to date. Since we now have 154 members, where are the 94?

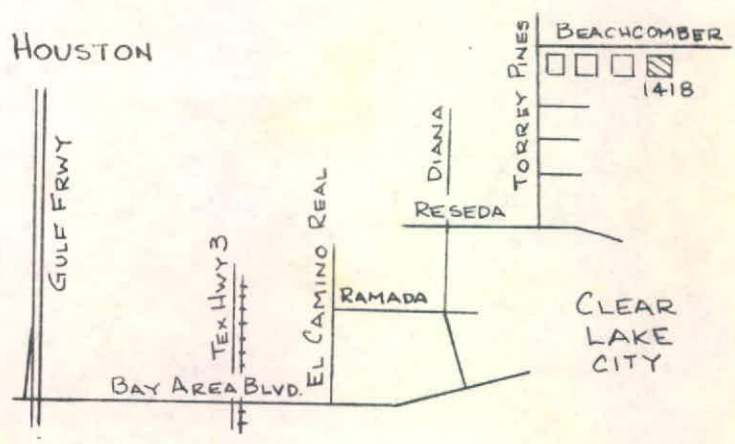
Take advantage of the STAMPED, addressed envelope enclosed in your January Bulletin to pay your dues as soon as possible. You need not put another stamp on it.
